Pocket Prairie Project



The prairies are a dying ecosystem native to our part of the Texas landscape. They provide habitat for many endangered species not found anywhere else on Earth. The prairie ecosystem is currently more endangered than the Tropical Rain-forests.

To learn more about prairies and how we can help them, MHFC has scheduled Mr. Jaime Gonzalez of the Katy Prairie Conservatory to give a presentation to EC and LE classrooms on Wed, March 19th. They will learn parts of a prairie ecosystem and more about why we want to conserve it.
