*Dual Language Programs ~

Toddler Community: Guides in our toddler community speak interchangeably, between English and their native language.

EC Community: Spanish class begins at the Early Childhood level, occurring weekly, during their community group time. Spanish

class is taught by a native Spanish speaker and offers an introduction to vocabulary, songs and literature.

Additionally, children are exposed to many different languages, introduced through informal communication, songs, stories, etc., which could consist of Spanish, Hindi, Arabic, Russian, etc. (depending on classroom

placement).

Elementary Community: Lessons with the Montessori materials are presented primarily in English (with exception of the Spanish language

materials), and guides converse primarily in Spanish. All guides are bilingual in English and Spanish, with Spanish being their native language. Additionally, Spanish class is included in the weekly "specials" schedule, in addition

to PE, Art, Music and Nature/Environmental Education.
