

COVID POLICIES & PROCEDURES

Revised Sept, 3 2021

The COVID handbook is revised as necessary.

HOURS OF OPERATION: 7:00 am – 6:00 pm (until further notice)

- -Reduced hours are necessary to eliminate mixing of classrooms.
- -Until further notice, parents are not allowed to enter the building, except for urgent matters or by appointment.
- -FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL: ALL students <u>must bring printed negative test results on their first day of School.</u> The test must be administered within 3-days (72 hrs.) before attending.



What Guides our Decisions?

- Decisions are based on data, recommendations and orders from our governing officials.
- Guidelines from:
 - CDC K-12 School Guidelines
 - Fort Bend County Health Department
 - <u>Texas Childcare Licensing</u>



OPERATIONS:

Staggered Arrival Times

Parents/Guardians walking to the school to drop-off/pick-up students <u>must wear a mask</u> and maintain 3 ft. social distance.

Staggered Drop Off: The purpose of staggered drop off/pick up is to reduce traffic and minimize the risk of spread

Full Day Program: 7:00 – 8:00 am (screening takes place at entry)
Academic Day Program: 8:15 – 8:30 am (screening takes place at car)

The designated drive-through time for MHFC and Elementary School is 8:15 – 8:30



OPERATIONS:

Staggered Dismissal Times

Academic Day Students: Use the drive-through lane, pedestrian foot traffic is not allowed during these times:

2:20 Toddler & Early Childhood

3:00 Elementary

Full Day Students: After academic-day dismissal:

- Toddler/Early Childhood, parents will come to the MHFC Building, knock on the door, and your child will be brought to you outside.
- Elementary, parents come to the door/gate of the Handwork Studio (EAST door) or playground, depending on time of departure. Your child will greet you outside.



OPERATIONS:

PLAN FOR CONTINUAL LEARNING

If a classroom closes due to direct exposure with a COVID confirmed person, then:

- A plan for distance learning is in place for temporary classroom closures.
- The closed classroom will transition to distance learning within 24 hrs.
- Details will be provided by your child's guide during classroom orientation.



Non-Pharmaceutical Interventions (NPI)

> Personal:

>> Face Covering, Washing Hands, Hand Sanitizer

> Environmental:

➤ Cleaning, Sanitizing & Disinfecting

> Community:

- >> Masks, Social Distancing*, and Staggering Arrival/Dismissal
- > Health Screening before building entry and temperature checks after lunch
- Constant monitoring of Illness & Symptoms

^{*}Social Distancing is enforced to the best of our ability.



NPI: Personal

> Face Masks required for adults and children aged 3 yrs. and older, while on School Grounds (including entrances), except when eating, drinking, or while supervising children outside.

If your child forgets to bring their face mask, a disposable mask will be provided.

> Washing Hands

- >> Proper handwashing **completely DESTROYS** the virus.
- ➤ Please reinforce proper handwashing at home.

> Hand Sanitizer

- >> When soap and water are not accessible, we use hand sanitizer*
- >> Hand Sanitizer is available in every occupied room.
- > EC and Toddler students <u>may not</u> bring personal hand sanitizer, Elementary students can.

*Hand sanitizer cannot be used on children aged 2 yrs. and younger.



NPI: Environmental

FACILITY

- >> Professional Janitorial providers clean the school Monday Friday.
- > Teachers/staff sanitize classrooms, materials, and commonly touched surfaces routinely during the day.



NPI: Environmental

CLASSROOMS

- > No mixing of classrooms
- >> Family Style Dinning is suspended. Lunch and snacks are served individually.
- > Individual plates, cups, and utensils are disposable.
- > Tables are labeled for individual use or sanitized between each use.



SCREENING

Individuals will be screened upon arrival and ENTRY WILL BE DENIED WHEN:

Displays one or more of the following <u>new or</u> <u>worsening</u> symptoms*:

- ✓ Temperature of 100*F or greater
- ✓ Cough
- ✓ Shortness of Breath
- ✓ Runny Nose
- ✓ Sore Throat
- ✓ Headache
- ✓ Loss of taste or smell
- ✓ Extreme fatigue
- ✓ Chills, Body, or Muscle Ache
- ✓ Diarrhea

IN PREVIOUS 10 DAYS:

OR

- ✓ Direct Contact with person who is COVID-19 positive.
- ✓ Direct Contact with a person who displays COVID-related symptoms and has not been cleared of having COVID-19.

*When symptoms are medically diagnosed as not related to COVID, the individual may enter with medical documentation.



SCREENING

FREE PCR Testing is available to every member of our school: staff, students, and families. Samples are distributed each Tuesday, collected each Wednesday, and results are provided before each new week.

Why do we test?

- Children under 12 are not vaccinated and at greater risk of contracting and spreading COVID.
- Often, children are asymptomatic, making it more difficult to detect and stop the spread.
- Vaccinated adults are not fully protected from contracting COVID, especially the DELTA variant.
- When everyone tests weekly, we are in the BEST position to stop the spread, protect those we love, keep our classrooms/school open, and do what we love!

We urge every member of our school (who is able) to participate in the FREE weekly PCR testing.



SYMPTOMS & ILLNESS

If a <u>student/staff member</u> is displaying any <u>new or worsening</u> COVID-related symptoms <u>while at home</u>, then:

- Stay home
- Notify School Admin
- > Follow return to school criteria on pg. 16

If a family member of a child in our school is displaying any <u>new or worsening COVID-</u>related symptoms, <u>while at home</u>, then:

- > Closely monitor your child for <u>new or worsening</u> COVID-related symptoms, and
- Notify the school immediately if symptoms appear, and
- Keep your child home, and
- > Follow return to school criteria on pg. 16



SYMPTOMS & ILLNESS

If a <u>student/staff member</u> is displaying any <u>new or worsening</u> COVID-related symptoms <u>while at school</u>, then:

- > The individual and siblings will be moved to the isolation area,
- > Parents will be called for **immediate** pick-up (staff member will leave the school immediately)
- > Area/s used will be disinfected
- Student/staff in same group will be closely monitored for possible symptoms.
- > Follow guidelines for return on pg. 16



SYMPTOMS & ILLNESS:

If a member of our school is confirmed positive for COVID-19

If student or staff, then:

- >> School will notify the Health Department and Childcare Licensing
- >> School will notify staff and families of all students in school
- >> Area used by person will be closed off (students/staff moved to a different room),
- > Open doors and windows, wait 24 hours to disinfect and sanitize.
- >> Follow guidelines by outlined by the Heath Department
- > Follow guidelines for return to school, p. 17



SYMPTOMS & ILLNESS:

If a <u>household member</u> of a student or staff is <u>confirmed positive</u> for COVID-19:

- > Student or staff (living with the family member) is assumed to have COVID.
- >> School will notify staff and families of that class/admin group.
- >> Follow guidelines for return to school, p.17



SYMPTOMS & ILLNESS

CRITERIA FOR RETURN TO SCHOOL

In the case of an individual who is displaying <u>new or worsening</u> COVID-related symptoms:

- ➤ The individual is assumed to have COVID-19, and the individual may not return to school until the individual has completed the four-step criteria listed on p.16, or
- > The parent/staff must submit <u>a note from a medical professional or a negative test result</u>, clearing the individual with symptoms from active COVID-19 infection.



SYMPTOMS & ILLNESS

CRITERIA FOR RETURN TO SCHOOL

In the case of an individual or a household member who is <u>diagnosed positive</u> for COVID

The individual may return to school/work when <u>all</u> four of the following criteria are met:

- > At least 10 days since symptoms first appeared **and**
- > At least 24 hours with no fever without fever-reducing medication and
- Other symptoms of COVID-19 are improving and
- ➤ Negative COVID-19 test result (rapid or PCR) provided to school, within 72 hrs. of return date.

*Loss of taste and smell may persist for weeks or months after recovery and need not delay the end of isolation.



DIRECT CONTACT WITH INFECTED PERSON

DEFINITION OF DIRECT CONTACT:

- ➤ Someone who was within 6-feet of an infected person for a cumulative total of 15 minutes or more over a 24-hour period starting from 2 days before illness onset (or, for asymptomatic patients, 2 days prior to test specimen collection) until the time the patient is isolated.
- Member living in the same household (presumed direct contact)



SUSPECTED DIRECT CONTACT WITH AN INFECTED PERSON

CRITERIA FOR RETUN TO SCHOOL:

If a person believes they or their child has had direct contact to someone with COVID-19 and are not currently sick, then:

> They should monitor their health for COVID related symptoms during the 14 days after the last day they were in close contact with the individual.



DIRECT CONTACT WITH AN INFECTED PERSON

CRITERIA FOR RETUN TO SCHOOL:

If a person had <u>direct contact with a lab confirmed COVID person</u>, and is <u>not fully vaccinated</u>, then:

- Person is not allowed to return to work/school until the end of the self-quarantine period from the last date of exposure (exception granted for critical infrastructure workers):
- > After day 10 without testing or,
- ➤ After day 7 after receiving a negative PCR test result (test must occur on day 5 or later from exposure date).



NEW OR RETURNING STUDENTS & STAFF

CRITERIA FOR RETURN TO SCHOOL:

New to School

- New students/staff and are required to provide negative PCR test results (administered within 72 hrs. of start date),
- As of June 1, 2021: New Employees are required to be fully vaccinated.

Return from Extended Break (5 or more consecutive days)

- Must submit negative COVID results before attending school (rapid or PCR). The test must be administered within 3-days (72 hrs.) of return to school.

As of Aug 1, 2021: Employees who are <u>not fully vaccinated</u> must test weekly for COVID, using the PCR test (provided by the school).



TRAVEL

You may have been exposed to COVID-19 on your travels. Regardless of where you traveled or what you did during your trip, the requirement below will help to protect others from getting COVID-19:

Slides 23,24 provide a simple chart outlining the CDC's recommendation pertaining to travel, domestic or international, vaccinated or unvaccinated.

Slide 25 outlines the School policy for the return to school following travel, domestic or international, vaccinated or unvaccinated.



DOMESTIC TRAVEL

Self-quarantine for 10 days if you don't get tested. Self-monitor for symptoms Wear a mask and take other precautions during travel cdc.gov/coronavirus



INTERNATIONAL TRAVEL

AFTER TRAVEL RETURN TO SCHOOL REQUIRES THE FOLLOWING:

FULLY VACCINATED:

- DOMESTIC: Self-monitor for COVID symptoms and get tested if symptoms develop. The individual does NOT need to self-quarantine or get tested if fully vaccinated.
- INTERNATIONAL: Get tested with a test 3 5 days after travel. Provide negative PCR test result prior to return to school. Self-monitor for COVID symptoms for 14-days.

UNVACCINATED, DOMESTIC OR INTERNATIONAL:

- Get tested with a test 3 5 days after travel AND <u>self-quarantine for a full 7-days</u> after travel.
- Provide negative PCR test results prior to return to school.
- Self-monitor for COVID symptoms for 14-days following travel.
